GERMAN CONTRIBUTION TO THE MOHAWK VALLEY - Firsching & Sons was started in 1906 by Joseph A. Firsching, a German immigrant who arrived in Utica in 1885. His first job was a spooler in the Globe Woolen Mills. He was an inventor of textile machines which were used to make corduroy and also women's lingerie. The company began making cotton underwear in 1915 fulfilling large contracts for the United States government during World War 1. A complete clothing line was introduced in 1923. Firsching was proud to be the only manufacturer to offer direct from factory to consumer individual made products. Products could be chosen from his monthly publication to salepersons throughout the country. Firsching & Sons operated out of several locations throughout Utica until their own mill was constructed in 1913 on Broad St. (Winter/Spring 2018, Oneida County History Center)
